Hardwood Receipts From Japan Show Big Increase.

GROWTH GREAT SINCE 1907

Arrival of Steamer Shinsel Mari Brings Total Receipts of Oak and Mahogany This Year Up to 6,000,000 Feet.

With the arrival yesterday of the Japanese steamship Shinsel Maru from Otaro with a cargo of hardwood, a argely increased new record has been fixed for the importation of such products from Japan.

Since January first there has reached this port from the Orient, a small percentage being mahogany and the balance oak, 6.013,743 feet of hardwood lumber, which retails at fully \$100 a

The husiness of importing hardwood from Japan to this port only assumed noticeable proportions in 1907, when 1,542,263 feet were delivered, although small lots had been received during a few previous years. The above and following figures are based on receipts from January 1 to September 1, during which months nearly all arrived except in 1908, when 1,316,151 feet was received in September.

From that year on the importation hardwood from Japan has increased at the port rapidly, as in 1909 it jumped to 2,054,884 feet; in 1910 it was 2,518,-340 feet, and in 1911 reached 3,340,-750 feet; the latter figures were nearly

doubled during the present year.

Oak lumber is scarce on the Atlantic coast, but much cheaper than on the Pacific, yet the transcontinental freight rates have not permitted competition with the Japanese article as it is shipped from the Orient at ballast rates. Stage of River Above Average.

The present stage of the water in the Villamette River at Portland is about four feet higher than at the same time last year and other years on the aver-age. While this precludes the possibility of any extremely low water this fall it is known that much of the snow of last winter in the mountains has not melted. While it rained un-usually hard in the foothills and along the coast during July and August, snow was falling in the mountains and adding to that already there. The prophesy is already being made that if the snowfall next winter is up to the average there will be more snow in the mountain districts than in any year since 1894.
