NORTH PORTLAND TO GET WATER MAIN. NGRTH PORTLAND TO GET WATER MAIN. —Plans and estimates for another re-inforcing water main for the Peninsula district will be prepared at once by the engineer of the waterworks. It will connect with the high service reservoir at Mount Tabor and will probably end at the city limits at tha northeast boundary at St. Johns. At present practically all of Albins and the Peninsula is drawing from the single main laid through Rose City Park about seven years ago, which cost \$250,000 and ends at Portsmouth. HERMISTON Or. Sept 2.—(Special.) —Resolutions deploring the recent an-nouncement of the Open River Trans-portation Company that it would dis-continue its service on the Upper Co-lumbia September 30, were adopted to-day by 250 excursionists on the Inland Empire boat between Umatilla and Pasco. A committee of the presidents of seven commercial clubs of Umatilla County was appointed and a meeting of representatives of all the towns near the Upper Columbia and Snake rivers was called at Pendleton September 12 to make plans to inaugurate a move-ment to increase the traffic of the bat lines. 


