"My idea is to get permanent injunctions against the owners of disorderly houses, joining the lessees and inmates as defendants. Then if these injunctions are disre-Then if these injunctions are disre-garded the defendants will be cited for contempt of court and fined or jailed, as may seem just in the wisdom of the court. There will also be the added undesirable notoriety.

Property Owners Given Chance. "We have already found out that there are hundreds of places in the city more or less given over to immorality,

more or less given over to immorality, known or unknown to the actual owners. I believe that in many instances the owners are innocent of intentional wrongdoing, although sharing in the profits of vice. In several cases the properties are owned by estates which are handled by agents, but of which the heirs are women and young girls. It would be manifestly unfair and injurious to these people to start court proceedings without notifying them to clean up, hence the sending out of notices.

"The Attorney-General will join with me in bringing the suits to enjoin these places as nuisances. The community interest in these matters is fast becoming an entity. The present movement is a result of the awakening of community consciousness to the necessity of subordinating selfish individual interests to the general interest. Property is made valuable because of the community being here and the owners owe the public the duty of keeping their premises morally clean. I believe that the majority of the owners will realize this and co-operate with me in preference to seeking to hamper me. I am not in a hurry and not going to be hustled into making missteps.

Publicity to Be Weapen.

"I am not a candidate for any public office and do not wish my motives to be misunderstood. I am in this thing as a result of a sincere desire to assist in making the city morally better and for this reason I hope and believe that the good citizens of Portland will aid in every way possible.

"I am going to use publicity as a weapen against property owners whenever it will help and whenever the public interest will, in my judgment, be best subserved by acting first and talk. tices.


