TAILORS CONTROL Suit Club Concern Charged With Running Lottery.

SUPREME JUSTICE WINS

JUDGE F. A. MOORE DEFENDANT IN COLLECTION CASE.

Suit Hinges on Payment Made in 1893—Principals' Children Are Married to One Another.

Less than half an hour was required by a jury in Judge McGinn's department of the Circuit Court yesterday to decide in favor of the defendant, Frank Burke, and against the plaintiff, Judge Moore.

The case was argued by Judge Moore and James Muckle, Jr. The jury found that the only balance owed by the defendants on a note for \$3000 executed by them jointly in 1888, Judge Moore as principal and Mr. Muckle as surety, is \$4512.25.

Judge Moore testified that he had paid \$2000 and produced documentary evidence to that effect. Dan J. Sweitzer, an attorney of St. Helens, to whom the money was lent, testified that he had a notebook in which he had jotted down a memorandum about receiving the money and paying it to Mr. Miles.

OWNER IS RESPONSIBLE

Ordinarily the property-owner recognizes only one duty of his tenant, and that is the paying of rents.

"We are going to make the property-owner responsible for the policing of his property, and if he does not correct the evils after they are pointed out to him an injunction will be secured in the Circuit Court compelling him to abate a public nuisance.

The object of the ordinance requiring the names of owners on buildings is that we can proceed against them without the expense of discovery of the owners. It requires as much investigation of the records in many cases to discover the owner of a house as it does to secure the evidence of wrongdoing on the premises.

"If the owner of a property is forced to place his name on it, he will exercise more diligence in seeing that no violations of the law are permitted. As it is now, the property is often in the hands of tenants who do not care for the law, and he pays no attention to it so long as the rents are paid promptly."
