Further consideration of an ordinance establishing the jurisdiction of the Commission of Public Docks over waterfront structures, which will force the builders of new wharves and warehouses to conform to the provisions of the municipal building ordinance, also to special features the Commission has outlined, was given at the regular meeting yesterday and as a means of acquainting all taxpayers with its terms it was decided to have it published in the daily papers.

Failure on the part of property owners to comply with the measure will be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$259 and the Commission is authorized to take steps to have any improperly constructed dock or building condemned.

Commissioner Keilaher reported that Mayor Rushlight has promised to give his individual attention to the situation on North Front street with reference to certain tracks of the Northern Pacific Terminal Company that are alleged to have been laid without suthority of a franchise from the city or grant from the county.
