

RIDE TO PITTSBURG WEARIES COLONEL

Physicians Confident, However, He Will Not Experience Relapse as Result.

SILENT CROWDS SEE HIM

At Many Stations Persons Shower Gifts on Wounded Man, but No Cheering Occurs—T. R. Due at New York Today.

PITTSBURG, Oct. 21.—Although ex-President Roosevelt was weary from his all-day ride from Chicago to Pittsburgh, he showed no other ill effects on his arrival here tonight and the physicians who are accompanying him are confident that he will reach Oyster Bay in almost as good condition as when he left Mercy Hospital.

Mrs. Roosevelt and the physicians watched the patient closely for any signs of a setback. As the day wore on and it became plain that he was resting comfortably, the tension was relaxed and tonight everyone on the Colonel's car was breathing easily. Colonel Roosevelt passed the day in reading magazines, talking and sleeping. As soon as he was brought to his car in Chicago he went to bed and remained there throughout the day.

Joits of Train Tire T. R.

The hardships of the journey were increased by several severe joits, caused by the imperfect action of a brake on the Colonel's car and once or twice the train came to such an abrupt halt that the Colonel was tossed about in his bed. The Colonel was suffering from nervous exhaustion when he left Chicago and he found the motion of the train most tiresome.

The progress of the Roosevelt train was watched by silent crowds. At many of the stations persons brought flowers and fruits to the wounded man and sent him messages of greeting. There was no cheering.

Dr. Alexander Lambert, of New York, who, with Dr. Scully L. Terrell, of Dallas, Tex., is caring for Colonel Roosevelt, said the wound had bled some during the day, but that the bleeding was merely the result of the draining of the wound and was an indication of the healing process. Bulletins were issued by the physicians during the day, but they merely reported that the Colonel was resting easy and that his condition was unchanged.

Physician Is Optimistic. There was little doubt in Dr. Lambert's mind that Colonel Roosevelt would be well enough to address the campaign rally planned for Madison Square Garden on October 30. The doctor said the Colonel would be permitted to speak for half an hour.

Colonel Roosevelt is due in New York at 8:35 tomorrow morning. His car will be taken directly to Oyster Bay and before 10 o'clock the Colonel probably will be in bed at Sagamore Hill. Until he has rallied from the effects of the trip, Colonel Roosevelt will be required to rest absolutely.

JOHNSON TO FILL T. R. DATES

Governor Starts on Trip Through Six Eastern States.

CAMDEN, N. J., Oct. 21.—Within a few hours after he had arrived in New York Governor Johnson had planned today a tentative schedule of the dates Colonel Roosevelt would have filled had he not been shot, and a few others, and was on his way to New Jersey to make the opening address of a two weeks' campaign in six Eastern states.

A private car was obtained for the Governor and he will travel in it until the close of the campaign. He expects to make several rear platform speeches each day in addition to his regular indoor addresses.

At Camden the Governor took Governor Wilson's labor record as his main topic. This was a subject Colonel Roosevelt had just begun to handle when he was shot. It was learned that all the material Colonel Roosevelt was to have used will be utilized by Governor Johnson in future addresses. Tonight the Governor spoke only of the Joline letter and Governor Wilson's address to the Princeton graduating class in 1908.

"Governor Wilson's attitude as shown in these two instances and others which I shall produce show his whole attitude toward labor organizations changed after he became a candidate for office," Governor Johnson said.

WILSON DEFERS HIS PLANS

Governor's Campaign Depends Upon How T. R. Withstands Trip.

PRINCETON, N. J., Oct. 21.—Upon the news tomorrow of the effect on Colonel Roosevelt of his trip from Chicago, will depend largely Governor Wilson's plans for the rest of the campaign.

The Democratic nominee said tonight that his speaking plans for the present were "up in the air." For October 31 a big meeting is being planned for Madison Square Garden, New York, but the nominee said he could not say yet whether he would attend. He will, however, on November 2 review in New York the parade of college men supporting him.

The Governor said his present intention was to do no more speaking until Colonel Roosevelt recovered. He intimated that if the Colonel was able to resume active charge of his campaign and direct it from Oyster Bay he might consider that sufficient reason for going into active campaigning himself.

T. R. WILL SPEAK IN NEW YORK

Colonel to Make Address at Madison Square Garden.

NEW YORK, Oct. 21.—Unless a serious setback occurs in the expected improvement of Theodore Roosevelt's condition, the Colonel will make his scheduled speech at the Roosevelt Progressive mass meeting at Madison Square Garden, this city, on October 30, according to announcement made today by Progressive State Chairman Hotchkiss.

"This is expected to be the ex-President's only public appearance in this state during this campaign," Mr. Hotchkiss said, and his other speaking dates will be filled by Governor Oscar Straus, candidate for Governor; United States Senator Clapp, Bourke Cockran and others. Governor Johnson and Mr. Straus and other state candidates will speak at the Madison Square Garden meeting.

ILLINOIS FOR TAFT

Poll Throughout State Shows Republican Ticket Victor.

WILSON IS BEHIND BRYAN

Farmers in Middle State Do Not Agree With Educator in His Assertion That Farmers Do Not Need Protection—Votes Lost.

CHICAGO, Oct. 21.—(Special.)—Illinois is claimed for President Taft and the election of the entire Republican state ticket was predicted by the managers of the Western Republican campaign today, and the forecast is based on a poll made by 1000 persons, representing every locality in the state.

"The poll of the state, begun more than two weeks ago by this committee, has been so far completed that a definite and positive prediction can be made that President Taft will receive the electoral vote, and the entire Republican ticket will be elected."

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New York Figures Encourage.

This shows a total vote for Taft, outside of New York City, of 431,354; for Wilson, 321,037, and for Roosevelt, 114,580, giving the President a plurality of 110,224. Four years ago the President carried Greater New York, and his campaign managers say there is no reason why he should not do so again.

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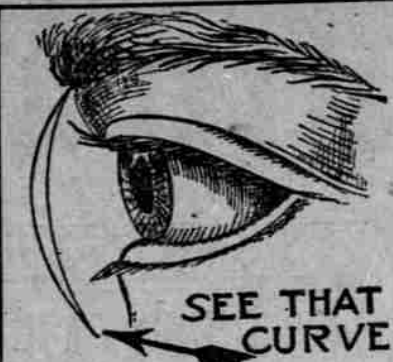
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NEW COMET IS DISCOVERED

Professor Brooks Finds Wanderer in Constellation Sextans.

GENEVA, N. Y., Oct. 21.—Dr. William Brooks, director of Smith Observatory and Professor of Astronomy at Hobart College, discovered a comet about 4 o'clock this morning in the Eastern sky.

Its position was right ascension 10 hours, 37 minutes, 20 seconds; declination south one degree 37 minutes. The comet is in constellation Sextans, with moderate motion eastward and visible through small telescopes. This is the 27th comet discovered by Professor Brooks.

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
