Improved train service between Portland and the East and between Portland and Salt Lake City may be the result of a conference of Union Pacific officials held at Salt Lake City.

The present meeting, contrary to the published report, is not a result of the long litigated merger of the Union Pacific and the Southern Pacific systems, as it was called before that decision was rendered.

While the regular winter schedules will be considered, it is reliably reported that a new fast train between Portland and Chicago, leaving here at midnight or 12-30 A. M. will be one result. This train, it is believed, will be in addition to the present service and will satisfy a demand that has been growing more general.

The regular midnight train has been authorized it would take the place of No. 6, now leaving here at 9 P. M. It is thought, however, that the running time would be "shortened" so that the time of arrival in Chicago would be the same as at present.
