# COMMITTTEE BACKS PLAN A B. COOPPE

Legislators Inclined to Be Worried Although Parties Interested Say There Is Nothing Wrong in Gathering Data.

OLYMPIA, Wash., Dec. 16.—(Special.) Many of the friends of those who were elected to the Legislature and some of the new-made lawmakers themselves are decidedly surprised at the blanks being sent out by the joint legislative NORTHW nmittee of the Direct Legislation League of Washington, State Federation of Labor, Farmers' Union and State Grange asking for detailed, personal information about each membe of the House and Senate and wanting to know "what influence is he likely to be most susceptible to?"

The questioner covers the method the lawmaker employs to earn a living, how successful he is, his political record, to what lodges and clubs he belongs, what his religious convictions may be and where and how well he is educated, as well as "other characterfatics or peculiarities which one should know in order to successfully approach and influence him."

It is explained that this is all being done in behalf of "people's legislation," and the information is desired, according to the document, "In order that the joint legislative committee may compile a card index which will be of inestimable value to us during the legislative session."

### Lawmakers Are Bitter.

Although the parties interested de-clare there is nothing wrong in gath-ering this information some of the legislators are inclined to be exceed-ingly bitter over it and it is likely that all lobbyists of every kind and description will be given rules and regulations as to how to conduct them-selves while in Olympia during the 1313 session as the result of the effort of the committee to gather this inforof the committee to gather this infor-mation. WEATHER CONDITIONS.

A well-developed disturbance, central over lowa, overfles the central portion of the Culted States, and another of similar cancer is central at sea of the New England Const. Moderately high pressure obtains from the eastern portion of the Lake region southward to the South Atlantic Coast. A large high-pressure field is spreading inlard over the Pacific Coast. Proclipitation has occurred on the central and northern Pacific slope, in the Rocky Mountain States, North Dakots. Missouri. Southern Texas, the Onio Vailey, Ontario, the St. Lawrence Valley and Maine. Briast to high winds have continued on the North Pacific Coast and Puget Sound and southwestern storm warnings are still being displayed at all seaports in this district.
