Formal Movement Starts in Washington to Get Bill Up in Legislature.

\$25,000,000 BONDS IS PLAN

Programme for State-Wide Good Roads Work Is Agreed To Unanimously and Pacific Highway Plan Is Well Supported.

SEATTLE, Wash., Dec. 20.—(Special.)—Indorsement of an appropriation by the next Legislature for the construction of a bridge across the Columbia River at Vancouver, Wash., provided that the State of Oregon contribute its share toward the cost, in connection with the building of the Pacific Highway, and indorsement of the inland Empire Highway and its connecting link, the Snoqualmie Pass, were given last night at a meeting of representatives of the New Seattle Chamber of Commerce, the Seattle Commercial Club, the Seattle (Wash.) Commercial Club, the Seattle Automobile Club, the State Good Roads Association and of the King County, Clark County and Lewis County Legislative delegations.

CASE FIXES PRECEDENT

HARRY SCHLOSS IS CONVICTED OF WHITE SLAVERY.

Court Rules That in Cases of This Kind Wife Can Be Forced to Testify Against Spouse. With the conviction, Thursday night, of Harry Schloss, for white slavery, in the United States District Court, Assistant United States District Attorney Evans closed his career in that court as a prosecutor. His record while acting as Assistant District Attorney shows that in every case he conducted in the Federal Court, he obtained his conviction. The Schloss trial was noteworthy because it established the precedent that in cases of this character, marriage of the victim by the one accused of white slavery is not to be considered a bar to the wife's testimony against her husband.

EX-INDIAN HEAD HIT HARD

Committee Finds Valentine Guilty of Violation of Law.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20.—Robert G. Valentine, who recently resigned as Commissioner of Indian Affairs, was censured in a report yesterday by committee on the western affairs of the Department after an investigation of charges against Mr. Valentine. The committee report said that he deliberately violated the civil service law, after an investigation of some of the charges against the former Commissioner, disapproved them.

TUBERGE DOOM SEEN

METCHNIKOFF SURE SCIENCE WILL ROUT WHITE PLAGUE.

LONDON, Dec. 21.—(Special.)—A few days since an elderly man, whose silky white beard and brown-gray hair—"cut long" and hanging thick at the back of his head—stood before an audience of fashionable people in the new lecture theater of the Royal Society of Medicine. He was Professor Metchnikoff, head of the Pasteur Institute in Paris, and the acknowledged chief of living biologists. He had just returned from his studies in the life of the water flea, which he has made a revolutionary discovery—that parasites in the blood of the tiny water flea, and caused by the phagocytes, or white cells, in the flea's blood.

KAISER WOULD RULE SKY

Twenty Zeppelin Airships May Be Built for War Service.

BERLIN, Dec. 21.—(Special.)—It is confidently believed in the quarters most closely interested that the production of a German "Aerial Navy Bill" is not far off. At the present time the necessary supplementary estimates will come before the Reichstag in the Spring. It is stated on reliable authority that the recommendations of the German war office and admiralty include the creation, as a beginning, of a fleet of 20 Zeppelin airships, of about 250,000 cubic feet capacity, and capable of traveling at 51 miles an hour and remaining aloft for four days and four nights without an intermediate landing.
