

JAPANESE SAILORS IN SHIP MUTINY

Ringleaders in Fight Resulting in Captain's Injury Are Fined \$10 Each.

CONSUL APPROVES ACTION

Foreign Office Will Be Notified and Blame Placed for Occurrence, When Mates or Men Will Be Punished.

"I feel that the sailors have been dealt with most generously by the American authorities," commented M. Ida, Japanese Consul, yesterday, on learning that Municipal Judge Taxwell had imposed a fine of \$10 each on seven men named Shiraike and Tanaka, ringleaders in the mutiny of Tuesday night aboard the Japanese tramp Manchu Maru, loading lumber at Immanipoulsen's.

Foreign Sailors Given Rights.

"We do not interfere with the prosecution of cases by civil officers in which aliens are concerned, for after sentence is served the defendants are to be secured and arrangements are made to deport them then," said J. H. Harbour, immigration inspector, later.
