CHANGES ARE DESIRED

EMPLOYERS MEET TO DISCUSS

MINIMUM WAGE BILL.

Committee is Appointed to Look Into

Various Features of Proposed Measure.

To obtain certain desired modifications in the proposed minimum wage bill, manufacturers and employers met yesterday informally and discussed the measure. A committee, consisting of C. F. Swigert, chairman; A. L. Mills and C. E. Grellie, was appointed to form a sub-committee from the manufacturers, so they might meet to discuss the bill from all sides.

"Such a bill should be tempered with common sense and drawn up with a reasonable regard to the competitive conditions which must prevail," said Mr. Swigert yesterday.

"The minimum wage is coming. Sometimes it is better to furnish employment at a rate lower than even we think desirable rather than not to furnish employment at all."

CRIMINAL RECORD TOLD

YOUTH ACCUSED OF THEFT HAS

BAD FAMILY HISTORY.

Jailor Suggests That Those Who Fa-

vor Sterilization of Criminals

May Find Good Argument.

According to Harry Grafton, jailer at the County Jail, the grandfather, father, brothers and other relatives of Joe Louisgout, a youth who was arrested yesterday following the finding of an indictment charging him with stealing articles from boats on the waterfront, have served time in the penitentiary. Grafton says several of Louisgout's relatives were sent to Salem when he was jailed, from 1904 to 1906, under Sheriff Word.

"Ofhand it would seem to me that this family is an example of where sterilization could have been used to advantage to prevent the propagation of a race of criminals," said Jailer Grafton. "I imagine that the Louisgouts would afford a good opportunity for study on the part of people interested in eugenics."
