ONE STATION URGED

All Electric Lines May Use Common Structure. Prospects of Union Station Seem Brighter, It is Declared, Since Southern Pacific Separated From Union.

EARLY DECISION DESIRED

Accommodations for Portland's principal electric systems—the Portland, Eugene & Eastern and the Oregon Electric—will be included in the proposed union station—when it is built.

There seems to be more of a disposition on the part of the interested railroads for a union station than there was a few years ago. That is due, probably, to the fact that the Hill interests have come around to that way of thinking.

Now that the Hill electric system is growing so rapidly, it will require separate tracks and terminals in the city within a few years. Likewise the Southern Pacific's electric lines—the Portland, Eugene & Eastern—will be operating trains into Portland within a few months and adequate terminals will be necessary.

Block to be Acquired. The original and present plans of the Portland, Eugene & Eastern provide for the acquisition of a full block in the heart of the business district and the erection thereon of a modern passenger station.
