COURT IGNORES PROTEST

Man Accused of Larceny of Ring Released by Trial Jury.

Extradition of a prisoner from California involving a round trip by Detective Hyde, a large expense to the county and a hard fight at Oakland on habeas corpus proceedings, went for naught yesterday when Fred Harris, accused of the larceny of a diamond ring, was dismissed in Municipal Court over a strong protest by Deputy District Attorney Deich.

The prosecutor resisted the order of the court because of the effort of the new District Attorney to establish a record for careful inspection of charges particularly when Deich's name had been taken to make sure that a cause of prosecution existed. He continued his protests until cut short the second time by the court with a curt statement: "The case has been dismissed."
