CHARTER ELECTION CAUSE OF TURMOIL

Emergency Clause Is Nearly Fatal to Ordinance as Maguire Protests.

RUN GIVEN STEAM ROLLER

Acting Mayor Baker Orders Clerk to Record "Aye" When Councilman Refuses to Cast Vote Either Way on Question.

Out of a tumultuous special session of the City Council yesterday morning welcomed. The department meetings are usually confined to members only, but on account of the wide interest in the commission form of government for the City of Portland. The ordinance carried an emergency clause and therefore required a three-fifths your for fore required a three-fifths vote for passage. But 12 of the 15 members of the Council were present, Councilmen Clyde, Daly and Wilhelm being absent, and had it not been for the strong hand of Acting Mayor Baker at the helm the continuous mische here. the helm, the ordinance might have

gone on the rocks.

Councilman Maguire at the very outwould not vote.

"Which way do you vote?" asked Acting Mayor Baker.
"I refuse to vote," said Maguire, with emphasis.

"Record Councilman Maguire as vot-aye," said the Acting Mayor to Clerk Grutae. Maguire attempted to pro-test, but the clerk was ordered to pro-ceed with the rollcall.

Then the insurgent Councilman wanted to have his vote changed to no, but this was denied, and Maguire sank back in his chair, flattened from his encounter with the steam roller, but defiant.

Councilman Jennings also protested that he did not like to vote yes on the ordinance for the same reason as had been advanced by Mr. Maguire, but said that rather than stand in the way of Portland's having the commission for the same than the magnitude of the commission of the com form of government in the principles of which he believed, he would vote against his inclinations. This, with the parliamentary kidnaping of Ma-guire's vote, made 12 favoring submis-

sion of the charter May 3. Another lively skirmish broke loose when the resolution providing for the official publication and printing of pumphlets containing the charter as amended was proposed.

Every voter to Get Copy.

Councilman Maguire again was the center of the fireworks and this time he was victorious. The resolution as presented provided that 10,000 copies of the charter should be printed for distribution to the voters, and when the fight was over it had been amended to provide that year.
