OLYMPIA, Wash., March 5. - (Special.)—With drastic provisions against non-resident persons, firms or corporations adding to any fund to promote an initiative or referendum campaign, and against any person receiving or paying any money for circulating peti-tions, a bill providing the machinery for direct legislation in the state was

passed by the Senate today.

Right of Appenl Given.

The statement may be objected to by the proponents of the proposed law, who have the right of appeal to the Superior Court. When the statement who have the right of appeal to the Superior Court. When the statement is prepared properly the Secretary of State issues the official petitions printed with spaces for 20 names on a page. These forms are turned over to persons desiring to circulate them. Strict provision is made against any person either paying or receiving pay for the circulation of a petition, the circulating to be done gratis or the petition to be left at some place for volunteer signatures.

When the required number of signatures are received the petitions go to the registration officers, who check the names and make a report to the Secretary of State, who investigates the sufficiency of the names. Ten percent of the total vote is necessary to initiate a measure, and six per cent to invoke the referendum on a measure already passed.

Non-resident persons, firms or corporations are prohibited from aiding financially or otherwise in any initative or referendum campaign. This provision in the bill was sublest to great
