

## MRS. MOORE BARES STORY OF SHOOTING

Mystery Surrounding Death of Chorus Girl Gradually Being Solved.

MAN WHO SHOT DEFENDED

Niece, Who Saw Tragedy, Declares Her Uncle Had Been Drinking Heavily-Mother of Accused Man Tries to Shield Son.

LOS ANGELES, April 6 .- (Special.) The whole truth in connection with the shooting of Mrs. Irene Mattis Smith, shooting of Mrs. Irene Mattis Smith, the chorus girl, who was slain in her mother's home in this city, will be made public within the next 24 hours, according to the District Attorney. The arrival in Los Angeles of Mrs. Alice Bohanon, of Wellington, Kan., mother of Mrs. Estelle Moore and Morris Bohanon, held in connection with the shooting, and sister of James L. Murphy, who is charged with having actu-

shooting, and sister of James L. Murphy, who is charged with having actually fired the fatal shot, having brought the investigation to a climax.

Weeping hysterically, Mrs. Moore threw her arms about her mother, whom she had not seen for years, and sobbed forth a part of the tragic story. Declaring that, next to her mother, she loved her uncle, James Murphy, the erring girl said that he had been under the influence of liquor for weeks, being in that condition the day of the shooting.

hooting. Mrs. Moore said that during the Mrs. Moore said that during the course of one day he had drank 148 bottles of beer in addition to two bottles of whisky and wine. The Moore woman, who has maintained a sullen silence since her arrest, at first endeav-

silence since her arrest, at first endeavored to persuade her mother to refuse to tell the authorities anything she might know, and failing in this, she refused to talk of the shooting and became hysterical.

Mrs. Bohanon vehemently accuses her brother and even her daughter of various misdeeds in the effort to shield her son. She confirmed previous allegations in letters she wrote that her brother had taken a shot at his father and attacked his son-in-law with brass knuckles, and also accused him of an unmentionable wrongdoing. She tells of the acquittal of her daughter from a bigamy charge, but-says she holds ina bigamy charge, but says she holds incriminating letters against her, but is unaware of the checkered career of her son since leaving home.
