NEW NORMAL PROPOSED

EDUCATORS WANT SCHOOL ESTABLISHED IN PORTLAND.

T. J. Garry, Superintendent of Clackamas County Schools, May Head Institution.

Portland educators are working on a project to establish a normal school in this city.

At the head of the movement are T. J. Garry, County Superintendent of Schools, and W. W. Williams, president of the Portland Business College.

While it is understood that all of the details of the plan have not been worked out, it has progressed so far that T. J. Garry, school superintendent of Clackamas County, has been asked to head the new institution.

It is intended to open it this summer with the idea of making it a permanent school.

ORIGON CITY, April 17.-(Special.) -T. J. Garry, who is one of the most successful and well-known educators of the state, is considering the invitation to head a new normal school in Portland.

The salary of the new position, it is understood, is \$4500 in excess of that which Mr. Garry is at present drawing.

For the past 10 or 20 years Mr. Garry has been prominent in Oregon educational circles. He is serving his third term as county school superintendent.

Before entering upon his duties for the county here, Mr. Garry was principal of the Milwaukie school, and also served in similar capacity at the Willamette and West Oregon City schools.

Mr. Garry is also well known as secretary of the Willamette Valley Stock Association.

CHEMAMA, Or., April 17.-(Special.) -Dr. John Steele, of the Presbyterian Board of Missions, assisted by Elmer N. Lafonso, of Chemama, closed a series of meetings at the Salem School Tuesday evening.

Dr. Steele has traveled extensively and for many years has been preaching to Indians in the United States. Last year he conducted a series of meetings at this place.

Mr. Lafonso resides at Chico, Cal., and was a student at the Salem School in 1901 and 1902. After leaving Chemama a wealthy woman of his home town, realizing his talent, educated him.

Mr. Lafonso has toured this country and foreign nations with concert organizations.

GAS TANKS MAY BE BARRED

Radius of 500 Feet From Residence or Church to Be Immune.

Following a protest by residents in the vicinity of Twelfth and Clinton streets against the erection of a gas tank in that neighborhood, the Council judicial committee yesterday adopted an ordinance to prohibit the building of such a tank in the city limits within 500 feet of a church or a residence.

If this ordinance is passed the gas company will be compelled to abandon work on the tank at Twelfth and Clinton streets.

The action of the committee was based on the presumption that gas tanks are dangerous to life, injurious to health and a general public nuisance.
