

BEARS UP ROUGH Winds Encountered by Vessel on Voyage Northward.

345 PASSENGERS ON LIST

Chicago Club Woman on "Eugenic" Lecture Tour Arrives—Wireless Strike Causes Little Trouble, Reports Purser Heywood.

The steamer Bear of the "Big 3" arrived at 5:45 o'clock yesterday afternoon with 345 passengers and 1100 tons of freight. Captain Nopander said that the ship had encountered head winds and although the Bear had little trouble in passing other north-bound steamers, it was impossible to keep her under full steam.

C. F. Heywood, purser, said that the Bear left San Francisco two hours late, through delay in loading the wireless freight. He said the rough voyage caused considerable seasickness.

Among the passengers was Mrs. Francis Shaw, of Chicago, who came from Los Angeles. Mrs. Shaw represents the Los Angeles Women's Club in Chicago.

Two new wireless operators arrived on the Bear, the former "S. O. S." men having left in San Francisco on account of the strike.

Marine Notes. The steamer Hoquiam cleared from Kalama for California yesterday.


The Russian bark Marichen, under charter to Clark-Wilson, is loading lumber at the steamer dock at the company's dock for South Africa.




