DR. C. H. ATWOOD ACCUSED

Unlawful Practice Charged in Warrant Alleging Manslaughter. Felony warrant charging manslaughter was turned over to the police yesterday calling for the arrest of Dr. C. H. Atwood, on complaint of Deputy Coroner Dunning. The death of Mrs. Elsie Garrison at St. Vincent's Hospital, yesterday, brought about the issuance of the information. The physician, it is charged, attended Mrs. Garrison, who was only 21 years of age, at her home, 457 Union avenue, and performed an unlawful operation, from which she contracted septicaemia. In support of the charge, Deputy Dunning went to the house yesterday and exhumed the body of a child in the basement. It is understood that Dr. Atwood is out of the city at present. Three times in recent years he has been before the courts on charges of a similar nature, escaping one conviction by a ruling of the Supreme Court. He was among

RIOTERS ARE FOUND GUILTY

Men in Fight During Waiters' Strike to Be Sentenced Today. For their part in a riot at Sixth and Davis streets last Friday, growing out of the picketing of a restaurant by the Waiters' Union, E. Schramm, W. Borstel and Axel West were found guilty of disorderly conduct by a jury in the Municipal Court yesterday. Sentence will be imposed today. Despite a gathering of members of the I. W. W. and a host of witnesses, who denied everything that was material, the jury gave preference to the testimony of a number of policemen and citizens who said that Borstel threw an egg at the restaurant and that Schramm and West assaulted Patrolman Stuart when he arrested the thrower.

Miss Ella Speck Leaves Hysterical Note to Man Friend. Leaving a hysterical note to a man, Miss Ella Speck, a recent arrival from Salem, shot herself in the breast in her room on the third floor of the Irving hotel, Sixth and Oak streets, yesterday, and was sent to St. Vincent's hospital, where her condition continued precarious last night. Excitement in the large crowd that gathered was heightened by the report that a man with blood on his face had emerged from the hotel and proceeded toward the North End. Police officers covered the district in hot haste and as a result Detective Goltz found Roy Campbell, a lodger in the hotel, at Sixth and Burnside streets. He had an abrasion on his face, but convinced the police that it was caused by the revolver used by the woman falling from the third to the first floor and striking him.
