

COUNCIL RECALLS

Proposed Salary Increases Withdrawn as Result of New Charter.

BAKER SEES "BAD FAITH"

Councilman Denounces Dunway in Move to Knock Out Charter. Daily Says Cognizance of Warning Not Up to Council.

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS IN BRIEF. Proposed purchase of Ross Island withdrawn from ballot at June election. Six proposed salary increase charter amendments withdrawn from the ballot.

Proposed amendments to the old charter of Portland providing for the issuance of \$300,000 in bonds for the purchase of Ross Island for a municipal industrial center, and the increasing of the salaries of 20 city officials, including 15 Councilmen, were withdrawn from the ballot at the city election June 2, by unanimous vote of the City Council at a special session yesterday.

The proposed salary increases were withdrawn because the old charter has been abolished and the new charter gives the City Commissioners power to fix the salaries of all appointive officials. The Ross Island measure was withdrawn on motion of Councilman Baker, who says the Council has been accused of bad faith in the proposition.

The withdrawal of the measures met with the unanimous approval of the Councilmen, except the fact that Ralph R. Dunway protested, declaring that he is going to bring suit which he says will result in the commission charter being knocked out of the ballot.

There is no reason for our allowing these measures to go on the ballot, he said, "merely because some people do not think the new commission charter will not be adopted by the voters."

Councilman Baker took the initiative in the adoption of a resolution withdrawing the Ross Island purchase amendment from the ballot. "I have heard all kinds of accusations," he said, "the most recent one is in relation to the people passing the bond issue for the Ross Island. The Commission getting a big raise-off. I have been opposed to this Ross Island proposition ever since the people voted it down at the last election, and I want to see it taken from the ballot."

Registration Request Made. A resolution was adopted requesting County Clerk Coffey to open the registration books for a week beginning Monday. The action was taken on the strength of a petition from women's organizations requesting the opening of the books for the benefit of 10,000 working women who have not had a chance to register.

An ordinance was passed changing the system of collecting water rents so that contractors will be required to pay for use of water in building, upon taking out a building permit. No permit will be issued until the water rent has been paid.

An ordinance providing for the appropriation of \$1000 to cover the cost of making preliminary surveys, and to terminate the cost of dredging the head of Columbia Slough to open the way for sewer systems in the Peninsula districts, was referred to the committee. It was the plan to have the measure go through as quickly as possible so that sewer extension work can be begun in the near future.

ALBEE'S CAMPAIGN WILL OPEN MONDAY

Mayorality Candidate Intends to Deliver Speeches Each Night Next Week.

BOOSTERS HOLD MEETING

First Speech to Be at Montavilla. Fast Campaign is Promised, to Which Aspirant May Devote Whole Time.

H. R. Albee will open his campaign for Mayor in Grebel's hall, Montavilla, Monday night at 8 o'clock, when he will deliver the first speech since the primary nominating election of last Saturday. He will make other speeches next week, probably every night, but final arrangements have not as yet been completed.

An enthusiastic meeting of Albee boosters was held last night in the Albee headquarters, second floor of the Henry building, when announcement was made that Mr. Albee will open his speech-making campaign in Montavilla Monday night.

Headquarters Are Crowded. Mr. Albee intends to proceed as fast as possible to make known his ideas on municipal problems and to become better acquainted with the voters, both men and women. He is arranging his business affairs so as to devote much of his time between now and the election, and at this end, Albee headquarters were opened yesterday morning, but all day, as the result of an announcement in The Oregonian, many men and women flocked to the offices in the Henry building and pledged him their hearty support in his campaign.

Citizens Pledge Support. The first day of the opening of Albee headquarters has been very gratifying, said B. E. Kennedy, campaign manager for Mr. Albee. "I have talked to hundreds of men and women today, citizens, regardless of their station in life, have pledged their hearty support for the election of Mr. Albee for Mayor. They believe in the new charter for the position of vast power that is created by the adoption of the new charter, in that he will be fair, conservative and impartial, if elevated to that position."

Mr. Albee himself declares that he will "go fast enough" to suit his friends. "At this time," he said, "I am not so fast as I was at the time of my last campaign, but this time he is prepared, he says, to devote practically all of his time to the campaign."

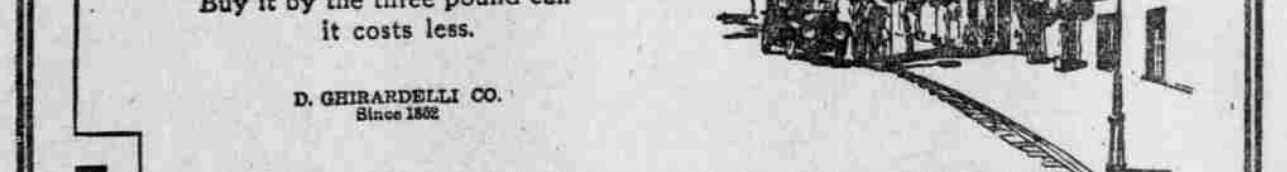

FOLK DANCES TO BE GIVEN

School Children to Contribute to Peninsula Festival.

MEASURES WITHDRAWN FROM THE BALLOT BY THE CITY COUNCIL.

Issuance of \$300,000 in bonds for the purchase of Ross Island. Increase salary of Councilmen from \$25 a month to \$25 a week. Increase salary of City Attorney from \$200 to \$300 a month.
