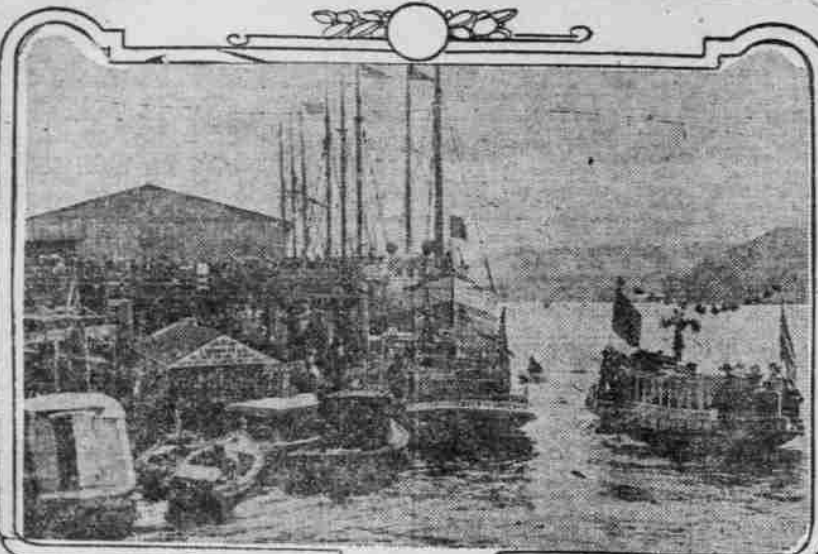


FLORENCE CARNIVAL IS BIGGEST SUCCESS YET
