

FLORENCE CARNIVAL IS BIGGEST SUCCESS YET

WEATHER CONDITIONS

The barometer is relatively low over the Rocky Mountain States, and a moderate country to exploit Glacier Park, which Rocky Mountain States, and a moderate high-pressure area is central over Nebraska. A disturbance of slight energy is passing down the St. Lawrence Valley. These pressure conditions have caused showers and thunder storms in California. Southern and extreme Eastern Oragon.
