Highest Percentage Reported From Irvington, Where Estimate Is 95 Per Cent.

MEN'S RECORD IS LOWER

Returns Show First-Choice Votes for Winners as Follows: Daly, 16,179; Dieck, 12,847; Bigelow, 8,408; Brewster, 11,124.
