Portland had another field day yesterday at the expense of the Oakland champions. Opportunity, hitting, good fielding, good baserunning—the Beavers did all these—and the visitors had a sloppy day in the field. Little wonder Portland won, 10 to 3.
The victory made it three games in four for Portland this far in the series. McCredie's men are only an infinitesimal distance from the first division—Seattle 477—Beavers 475.
Eugene Krapp was on the firing line for Portland, opposing two Oak twirlers, Pernoll and Parkin.
Pernoll was hammered to the shade of the dugout again in the opening game Tuesday and the same rough treatment was accorded him yesterday in the fifth inning.Doane's Homer Ends Pernoll.
Pernoll was touched for two runs in the second inning, and five runs in the fourth, so when Walter Doane opened the fifth by spanking one of Bud's southpaw shots over the right-field fence for a home run, Mitze thought it high time to yank Pernoll.
Parkin got by all right from that on to the eighth, when Leard and Cook added to an erratic day by inserting costly boots, and two more runs filtered over the rubber.

As for Krapp, the little man who specializes in damp shots for Portland—Gene had the bases loaded twice and had two or three thousand women fans on edge all the time, but he twisted inviolable ball in the pinches. Krapp was touched for nine hits, but only one of the three Oak tallies was really hard-earned. Krapp's error and a hit by Noss scored the first, a single by Coy that was converted into a triple when the ball bounced freakily over Coulson's head, gave the Oaks another hitting following with a single, Zacher drove in the legitimate run in the ninth on a double after Leard's hit.

Beavers Hit in Pinches.
While Walter Doane and Fred Derrick featured with the regulars for Portland, several other Beavers swayed in the pinch.
Coulson's double, McCormick's single, a boot and Berry's single, and a single by the Oaks infield will furnish the key to the fifth-inning puzzle. Lober broke in at left field in his first game for Portland and drove in a run with his lone hit.
