Dredge Fuel is Exhausted Coal Will Be Tried on Columbia to Continue Channel Work.

Coal is to be tested on the dredge Columbia, engaged in digging a channel to the northward of Sand Island, with a view to substituting it for the present fuel, the Port of Portland Commission being unable to purchase more wood and "hog" fuel from the mills during the freshet. A barge of wood went to the Columbia Tuesday and it is estimated it will be sufficient for a run of 28 hours, after which coal will be tried.

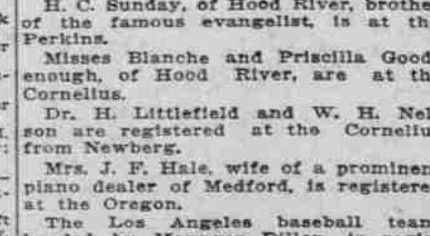
FACTORIES MAY BE BUILT
