CLUB OPPOSES VIADUCT.—The Roseme-
re-Mansook Improvement Club will
oppose the erection of a viaduct at
Sandy crossing of the O.W.R. & N.,
and at the meeting held in Roseme-
re Church, East Forty-fifth street and
Sandy boulevard, Tuesday night a
resolution was adopted asking the Com-
missioners to stop proceeding with the
viaduct. The resolution declared that
the viaduct would damage and con-
tinue such valuable property, besides
imposing a heavy tax on the Roseme-
re Park, which was owned by George
Perkins, who addressed the meeting,
estimated the cost at \$100,000, 20 per
cent of which would be taxed to the
property adjacent to it back of the
viaduct. That gates would be infixed to
protect the crossing.

MOTHER'S PLEA WINS.—Because of
his mother, who tearfully declared a
court that it was her first offense
when he begged for her to give him
another chance, Circuit Judge Gateny
yesterday day paroled Orin J. Woods, aged 20,
who pleaded guilty to a charge of pass-
ing a bad check. The defendant was
two years in the penitentiary. The
mother explained that her boy became
discouraged and started drinking be-
cause he was thrown out of employ-
ment suddenly. Both she and the boy
declared that he was under the influ-
ence of intoxicants when he passed the
check.
