BOSTON, July 29.—G. F. Touchard and W. M. Washburn, of New York, the latter a Harvard student, won the Eastern championship doubles today from N. W. Niles and A. S. Dabney, of Boston, former Eastern champions, 6-2, 7-5, 3-6, 14-12.

In the final of the Longwood singles, William Johnston, champion of the Pacific Coast and former Oregon titleholder, playing in whirlwind style, defeated G. P. Gardner, Jr., of Boston, 6-2, 6-4, 6-4.

Touchard was the particular star of the doubles. He sustained the brunt of the attack of his opponents, and his play at the net was revelation. Johnston, the San Francisco schoolboy, played the same game in his contest with Gardner that prevailed against W. J. Clothier in the tournament. The Pacific Coast champion's speed was dazzling.

There was little or no lobbing, the playing being in the main strong, straight-handed strokes by both men, save that Johnston's drives were manifestly better placed.
