MEXICAN REFUGEES ASK FOR RELEASE

Federal Soldiers Under Guard at Fort Bliss File Habeas Corpus Proceedings.

INSURGENTS ARE MOBILIZED

Constitutionalists Determined Not to Attack Guaymas if Government Forces Will Come Out

EL PASO, Tex., Aug. 4 .- An attempt is being made by local attorneys to secure the release of \$31 Mexican federal soldiers under guard at Fort Bliss by sabens corpus proceedings in United States District Court at Austin The suit was instituted today. The sttorneys allege that the Mexicans are illegally restrained by the United States Government,"

The Mexican soldiers were arrested at Naco and Nogales, Ariz., as refugees, losing battles with the constitutionalists three months ago.

Practically all the insurgent state troops are mobilized at Batamoral, awaiting the advance of the federals out of Guaymas, a few miles to the

awaiting the advance of the federals out of Guaymas, a few miles to the south. The official explanation is that the constitutionalists are determined not to attack the California gulf port if there is any possibility of the government forces advancing to meet them. Though it has been denied that any solicitation of the foreign consular agents at Guaymas had anything to do with the original withdrawal of the insurgents, it is said that fear of injury to constitutional sympathizers is prompting the delayed attack.

The state officials at Hermosilio declare that the federals remain bottled in Guaymas and may leave the town by boat without fighting.

G. Cooper was severely handled by the robbers. A knife was drawn across his throat, but he managed to escape from his captors, who were taking him to the mountains after they had rified the offices and stores of the corporation.


