KANSANS LOOK TO OREGON
Drouth and Crop Failures Cause Farmers to Turn West.
One result of the drouth in Kansas will be more settlers for Oregon. A letter received by the Chamber of Commerce yesterday is a sample of many others from farmers in the heat-stricken districts, who want information about Oregon.
Writing from Moline, Kan., Theodore Baker asks that some of the latest literature on Oregon be sent to six persons whose names he incloses. He adds: "These persons are all farmers and would like to try some country that is not so dry and hot as it is here. We have had four short crops in succession, and this year has been a complete failure. The long-continued drouth has burnt up the pastures and dried up all the ponds and wells, so everybody is hauling water. We want to learn the facts about Oregon."
In the Chamber's mail also are letters from Montana wheat growers, who wish to ship their wheat to Portland instead of to the East, as they are now doing.
HOUSE-MOVER MUST PAY
Telephone Company Gets Judgment for Moving Wires.
When he gave judgment for \$218 in favor of the plaintiff in the case of Home Telephone & Telegraph Company against A. D. Moore, house mover, District Judge Bell decided yesterday that when persons want buildings moved they must pay the telephone company for so arranging its wires as to permit the structure to pass underneath.
The amount of judgment was what the house company expended when Moore wanted to move a building. Moore refused to pay, asserting that the company's franchise required it to raise its wires.
"BUYERS' WEEK" POPULAR
Oregon, Washington and Idaho Merchants Will Come to Portland.
From all through Oregon, Washington and Idaho, letters are pouring in to the Portland Commercial Club from merchants accepting the invitation to come to Portland early in September as guests for "Buyers' Week." More than 25,000 of these invitations were sent out.
A programme for the entertainment of the buyers and their families is being arranged. There will be a big reception in the clubrooms as an event of the week with a smoker, a banquet, and a luncheon at the Ad Club are other features arranged for. Additional ones will be announced later.
To get the special fare refund allowed by the railroads, buyers should get their tickets to Portland on the Thursday, Friday or Saturday of the week preceding "Buyers' Week," or Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of that week.
TRAVEL TO BREAKERS BIG
North Bank Statistics Show Previous Records Broken.
Statistics compiled by the traffic department of the North Bank lines show that the Summer travel to the Clatsop beaches this Summer is the heaviest in the history of the resorts.
The Astoria division of the North Bank system has already carried approximately 20,000 passengers to the beaches this season. Return-trip tickets have been sold to the number of 15,000.

FORMER PASTOR RETURNS
