

STEAMER CENTENNIAL.

It was in July, 1963, that the steamer Centennial was last at Portland. She sailed from Hakodate, February 24, 1906, and was not heard from again until it became known at Seattle Wednesday that a Rus-sian expedition had located her in the ice off Saghalin Island, Okhotsk Sea, Siberia, Captain H. Gilboy, who commanded her, was as well known here as the vessel, though he was not skipper on the occasion of her farewell voyage to the river. The Centennial was built in 1859, and at the time of her disappearance was owned by the Charles Nelson Company, of San Francisco.
