# MINE OWNER PAYS DEBTS YEARS OLD

Charles W. Chamberlain Settles \$25,000 Bankruptcy Obligations.

### COPPER STOCK HELPED IT

Former Exeter, Mo., Merchant's Bills Outlawed 14 Years Ago, but His Determination to Win Is Successful.

ST. LOUIS, Dec. 11.-Charles W. Chamberlain, 65 years old, who suffored business reverses while running country store at Exeter, Mo., 21 ears ago and availed himself of the bankruptcy act while \$25,000 in debt, has recouped his losses by investments copper mide stock, and this week will pay back the last of his indebtedness, outlawed 14 years ago.

Chamberlain will pass this Christmas free from financial incum grances-the first Christmas he has en out of debt since 1892. Next week, with receipts for all his debts in his cossession. Chamberlain will depar from St. Louis for Los Angeles, Cal, there to join two of his sons and retire from business "a free man," as he ex-

Unwillingly, Chamberlain told a reporter the story of his failure an uphill fight to overcome his moral obligations. Mr. and Mrs. Chamberlain have four children, a son in St. Louis, one in Fort Smith, Ark., and two in Los Angeles.

### Man Sticks to It Too Long.

As a proprietor of a general store at Exeter, Chamberlain at first was a success. But he "stuck to it too long" he said, and at the uge of 42 found himself impoverished, with a wife and four children, and debts of about \$25,000. His creditors were chiefly wholesale houses in St. Louis and Chicago from which he bought his stock for the Exeter store. After promising his creditors he would seek to repay his debts, which he says few of them seemed to bolieve, Chamberlain took the bank-

borrowed money to bring his family to St. Louis, where he obtained employment in a dry goods store. employment in a dry goods store. Working even in the periods allotted him for Summer vacations, Chamberlain skimped and saved. He provided well for his family after he had gotten his footing again. With his small savings he invested in copper stock with the New Cornelia Copper Company, recently taken over by the Calumet and Arizona Mining Company, operating mines at Ajo, Pina County, Arizona.

He Is Now Director in Firm He is Now Director in Firm.

In recent years Chamberlain has become a director of the mining firm. A few years ago he paid off \$5000 of his indebtedness, and now is sending out checks covering \$16,000 more. Before he departs for California, he says, he will have paid off everything. The debts were outhawed nearly in years ago and could never have been collected, but Chamberlain said he always felt morally obligated to repay his credmorally obligated to repay his creditors, and in order to do that denied himself everything but the bare necessities of life for 21 years.

'I was 44 years old when I went bankrupt and I am 60 now, but I feet many years younger with the weight of financial obligations off my mind Chamberlain said. "I am going to the land of sunshine a free man. I'm going to give up my office and enjoy the little things that have been out of my reach and the reach of my life so long. I am going to spend one of the happiest Christmas holidays of my life in Los Angeles. I intend to start life anew with the scenes of my failure and battle to regain honor in the busi-ness world far behind me."
