



BY April, 1914, the Stevens Building, now being constructed at the southeast corner of West Park and Washington streets, diagonally across from the lower Washington street corner of the Pittock block, will be completed and ready for occupancy. The steel framework in the building is already in place for the full height.

This new building is to have 12 stories and basement, all of steel, and will be absolutely fireproof. The frontages are 100 feet on West Park street and 50 feet on Washington, and the cost is to be \$350,000. Entrance will be from Washington street. The exterior is to be dressed with cream color pressed brick and terra cotta, which promises a striking surface appearance.

The owner is T. B. Wilcox, president of the Portland Flouring Mills Company, whose Wilcox building, three blocks east of the Stevens building, on the southeast corner of Sixth and Washington streets, resembles the new one.
