

BRIDGE ENGINEERS MAY GET FLAT FEE

Waddell & Harrington Offered \$65,000 for Services Are to Answer Tomorrow.

HEDRICK FIRM BIDS AGAIN

"Are You Hagglng?" Asks J. L. Harrington When Rival's Telegram Is Read—Holman Wants West at Meeting.

Whether or not Waddell & Harrington, will design and superintend the building of the Columbia River interstate bridge for a flat fee of \$65,000 is the issue now, as a result of a long conference held yesterday afternoon in the County Commissioners' office.

Governor Has Three Favorites.

Major Bowley said Governor West is desirous of having Waddell & Harrington design and superintend the construction of the bridge, but thinks that the fee should be made more comparable with that offered by Hedrick & Cochrane and Hedrick & Cochrane, the other two engineers favored by Governor West.

The reading of this telegram from Hedrick & Cochrane caused Mr. Harrington to say that the sending of such a telegram was a breach of professional ethics.

The selection of a consulting engineer was made by your commission after proposals from the firms had been considered.

Major Bowley explained that the telegram was received by him and one he had sent Monday asking Hedrick & Cochrane if they would accept should a contract calling for a flat fee of \$25,000 be tendered them.

Harrington Sees Burden. In discussing the cut in fee imposed by the new contract, Mr. Harrington said that the commission proposed to burden him in three ways.

"First you would exact a bond of \$100,000 for the growth of the country for four years; second, you would exact from me that I meet all the cost of securing patent rights for any type of bridge spans; and, third, the contract would be void should the bonds not be sold.

"Then it seems that you are hagglng," said Mr. Harrington.

"The whole controversy, I think," concluded Mr. Harrington, "is that you are not a clear understanding of the services we render for the money and our thoroughness in savings to our clients."

Major Bowley said that he and Governor West were of the opinion that because of the length of the bridge, requiring many spans that were duplicates of others, that the designing would be less difficult and the fee should be reduced.

The commission advised Mr. Harrington yesterday that they desire the best bridge possible for the available funds rather than a bridge sufficient to meet the present needs, after a study of traffic conditions and a reasonable allowance for the growth of the country.

"The life of the bridge should be 50 years," Mr. Harrington said, "if the proper precautions are taken in the building and care of the structure and is not overloaded. Most of the bridges we tear down now are destroyed because of their inherent inadequacy rather than because of increased use."

Approach Question Broached. The question of approaches was broached, but no action taken other than an opinion expressed that there would not be sufficient funds to build but one satisfactory approach.

The meeting yesterday was called by Major Bowley, representative of Governor West, had had time to consult with Commissioner Holman, District Attorney Evans and Mr. Harrington. Major Bowley came direct to the commissioners' office from his car and had no time to confer with the other members of the commission regarding the views of Governor West. The commissioners' room was crowded in contemplation of the meeting. At the afternoon session only a few spectators were present.

EUROPE PREPARING MEXICAN POLICY

United States Expected to Assume Obligations for Non-Interference.

One Diplomat at Washington Lets It Be Known His Country Wants to Prevent Loss of Property of Its Citizens.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6.—Frequent exchanges and conferences between the Ambassadors and Ministers in Washington are tending to unite them on a line of conduct regarding Mexico which, while conforming to the plans of the United States, involves an understanding as to obligations the American Government will be expected to assume as a result of her attitude of non-interference.

So far this common understanding has not taken the form of direct pressure, but the State Department is kept informed of the expectations of the European powers. General information relates to the protection of the vast financial interests which citizens and subjects of the powers have in Mexico, no disposition being exhibited of an intention to bring in the political side of the question. In fact, more than one of the diplomatic representatives here has informed the Department that his own government was interested in preventing loss of large material interests to its citizens and beyond that did not care what the United States did, so long as it was in the line of what was to be done, so that it might take proper precautions for the protection of the lives of its citizens.

The Red Cross authorized the Department, through Vice-Consul Simpich at Nogales, Sonora, to draw an additional \$5000 for use in relieving destitute in the interior of Sonora. Dr. Mensendieck, the American physician now at Vera, will supervise the expenditure of this fund.

Ernest P. Bicknell, of the Red Cross, is en route to Laredo, Texas, tonight from Houston to investigate conditions existing there among the Mexican soldiers who have been brought to that point from Nuevo Laredo, across the Rio Grande.
