"Governor West has directed the Attorney-General to begin the proper legal proceedings immediately," said the Sheriff. "The incorporation of the property there is only a fraud to cover up the real purpose of the club." Sheriff Word announced also that one of the gambling cases, in which defendants have been dismissed by the District Judges, would be heard by Judge McGinn of the Circuit Court as soon as that jurist returns from his California trip. Sheriff Word said last night the judge would be back and ready to hear one of the gambling cases tomorrow.

The case heard by Judge McGinn will be prosecuted by Deputy District At-torney Robison, who was appointed apecial representative of Governor West, following a conference yesterday between the Governor and District At-torney Evans.

The District Judges, against whose rulings the Sheriff and Governor have taken exception, say that they have interpreted the law fairly.

"All the gambling cases that have been brought before us," said Judge Dayton last night, "have been cases in which proprietors of saloons have been charged with conducting a gambling house. The evidence, which has been almost identical in all the cases, has not been sufficient to hold the defendants to the grand jury. Whether the cardplayers, who have admitted that they were playing for the drinks, were gambling has never been at issue and the evidence has never been sufficient to show that the proprietors were guilty of conducting any gambling games. The next time a case is brought before one of us I, as presiding judge, am going to ask all three Judges to sit en bane on the case." ane on the case."


