DUBLIN, March 5 .- (Special.) -The riots in Dublin which filled the hospitals with injured have again focused public attention on the Dublin force of giant policemen. William B. Black, the well-known journalist, for instance does not mince words about them. He says they are "the worst force in Europe," and that the real feeling of Dub-lin is mirrored in the fact that a crowd of over 40,000 attended the funeral of one of the men they fatally injured

The Dublin Metropolitan Police are quite the biggest men in Europe-and that in two senses. They present so marked a contrast physically to the whole civilian population around them.
