Sister-in-Law, for Whose Love He Is Said to Have Killed. Is Chief Accuser.

WIFE'S LAST WORDS TOLD

"Dolly, I Am Dying. Andrew Has Poisoned Me." Witness Swears Her Sister Said—Physicians Add Evidence at Hearing.

EUGENE, Or., April 3.—(Special.)—Largely upon the testimony of Dolly Lewis, the sister-in-law, for whose love he is accused of slaying his wife, Andrew Eoson was bound over to the grand jury today, charged with murder. The crowd which filled the courtroom during the preliminary hearing held its breath as the girl testified against the man.

Dolly, I am dying. Andrew has poisoned me. He gave me whisky, and it was so bitter—oh, so bitter! Take good care of little Stanley."

These were the last words of the dying woman in the sister said. She had been awakened, she testified, about the morning, and found Mrs. Eoson at the point of death.

The words were corroborated by Marie Hendricks, a 14-year-old girl who also was in the house at the time. Physicians testified that the woman was normal and healthy and that they believed she had died from the effects of a dose of poison. This was determined after the body had been dissected at the instigation of the District Attorney.

Questions asked witnesses indicate that Eoson's defense will be that his wife committed suicide. The incriminating evidence against him is that he had \$5000 insurance transferred to his wife's name a few days before her death, and that, according to the District Attorney, he was infatuated with his sister-in-law.

ALL AT RALLY REGISTERED

Speakers at North Portland Civic League Session Get Surprise.

At the North Portland registration rally of the Oregon Civic League Thursday night the speakers found to their surprise that all present had registered. T. T. Goer and Arthur J. Moulton represented the Republican and Progressive parties.

Judge John H. Stevenson took a civic rather than political view of the matter. He made a stirring appeal for registration in such a part as a means of preserving majority rule.

Charles W. Barzee, Socialist, and P. Kendall, prohibitionist, argued over which party was best advocating suffrage and the direct primary.

Tonight in the Albina Branch Library, 350 Knott street, another rally will be held, with all the parties represented.
