GOVERNOR GETS BLAME

STATE ENGINEER LAYS EXPENSE

OF OFFICE TO MR. WEST.

Record Is Cited to Show Executive Advocated Extra Appropriations and

Hends One Costly Board.

SALEM, Or., April 21 .- (Special.)-

State Engineer Lewis today fired a

broadside at Governor West, who does

not like the State Engineer and is pre-

paring a bill for initiation to abolish the office. Ar. Lewis recalls certain expenditures which the Governor rec-omended. The statement follows: "It is implied by Governor West that

a great saving can be made by certain changes in the State Engineer's De-partment. The record shows this office

to be a revenue producer, rather than an expense to the taxpayer.

"The total appropriation for the salary and expenses of the State Engineer, and services of assistants, and expenses of the office and department of the State Engineer," is \$10,000 per annum.
