

SHOW PLAYS MAKE

Grant of \$4000 Assures Assembling of Land Products.

LARGER SCOPE PROPOSED

Winners Must Give Association Privilege of Exhibiting at San Francisco Under Producers' Names—Date Not Chosen.

Granting of \$4000 to the Pacific Northwest Land Products Show by the County Commissioners on Friday assures the holding of a land show this fall, according to John S. Beall, president of the Land Show Board.

The place of holding the exhibit has been a serious problem, but it is understood that a place sufficiently large to accommodate the exhibit has been procured by W. J. Hofmann, chairman of the committee on place of meeting.

The plan to hold a combined exhibition with the manufacturing exhibit at a larger floor space than has been available heretofore. Lack of adequate space was one of the factors leading to the decision not to hold the annual show last fall.

The date has not been set, but it is probable that the latter part of October will be the most desirable time. Exhibitors are at their best then, and the county and state fairs are out of the way.

A joint meeting of the board of directors of the Pacific Northwest Land Products Show and the directors of the Manufacturers' Association will be held at the latter's headquarters today to make plans for the show and arrange for the employment of a director, the raising of the funds necessary and the selection and location of prospective exhibitors of the new plans.
