follows:

Have sent the following telegram to Secretary William Jennings Bryan:

"Noticing in the press your request on the railroads for half-rate fare for Mexican refugees. I beg to offer your good office the following steamers on our line plying on the Pacific Coast from San Diego north, at half rate: Steamers Ceillo, Multnomah, Willamette, Klamath, Yosemite, San Ramon and Northland, and probably the turbine steamships Yale and Harvard. Travel this time of the year is very heavy, but the companies feel that it is their duty to help the Government out."

Mr. Bollam received a reply last night from Secretary of State Bryan as follows:

This department appreciates the generous offer referred to in your telegram of April 26. Copies of your telegram have ben furnished to the War and Navy departments.
