An exhibit of "Made-in-Oregon" goods has been arranged for by the Manufacturers' Association of Oregon, to be given in the basement of the old part of the Meier & Frank store, beginning on Thursday of this week and lasting until the night of May 15. This decision was reached Friday after it had been learned that the County Commissioners had granted the request of the Land Products Show for \$4000 with which to put on the Land Show this Fall, as it was hoped to hold a combined show in some large place. This exhibit will serve as a "preliminary heat" to the larger show in the Fall. The entire basement space on the Morrison-street side of the old building will be devoted to the exhibit. In arranging for the exhibits the widest possible variety has been sought, so that the many different industries of the state might be represented. In one corner a large booth will be devoted to bubbling fountains, while opposite it will be shown the newly-patented loggers' shirts, warranted to shed water. One of the largest exhibits will be the making of mattresses, and across the aisle one of the knitting mills will have a force of girls turning out sweaters. The various furniture factories will show their latest patterns, emphasizing Portland's position as the Grand Rapids of the Pacific Coast. The display will be formally opened on Thursday morning under the auspices of the Manufacturers' Association. Colonel David M. Dunne, president of the association, being in charge of the exercises at that time.
