Growers and Packers are Both Holding Back.

CROP OUTLOOK NOT GOOD

Present Estimates are of Yield in Northwest of Not Over 40 Per Cent—Good Prices Paid in Business So Far Done.

There is little change in the price situation and not much of interest on this season's crop aside from the fact that the crop over the entire Northwest is very short. From the best estimates obtainable at this time there will probably not be over 40 per cent of a crop. No important business is being done by either grower or packer, both sides being inclined to wait for developments, or until such time as the actual size of the yield can be arrived at. A few contracts, however, have been made with growers at 7 1/2 cents for 40-55 and a quarter cent less for counts of five.
