EIGHT MEXICANS ARE THOUGHT TO BELONG TO THIEVES' BAND.

Only Small Part of Jewelry, Valued at \$1000, Identified, Though Many Victims See Alleged Loot.

Eight Mexicans and two Americans were arrested yesterday and Tuesday in an effort to break up what the police say is an organized gang of house and hotel burglars which has operated in Portland for nearly a month.

The following persons, arrested yesterday, are believed to be members of the gang: Martinez Martinez, a Mexican laborer, 21 years old, was arrested at East Twelfth and Pacific streets by Patrolman Hillton.
