Freedlander, of the firm of Freedlander & Seymour, architects, of New York, who arrived in the city yesterday to confer with members of the City Commission regarding the auditorium mixup. At a meeting with the Commissioners yesterday the question was govern up. At a meeting with the Commissioners yesterday the question was gone into thoroughly, but no definite settlement of the question of the fee due to Mr. Freedlander for drawing the original plans for the building was reached. Mr. Freedlander came here to press his claim for \$15,000, which he says is due for the preparation of the plans for a building to be creeted on a double block, which plans have been discarded by the Council because a double block for the building is not available, and the building as planned would gost \$156,000 instead of \$450,000, which is the limit of the amount available for the structure.

Council because of the fact that he pre-pared plans involving an expenditure of \$745,000, whereas the rules of the contest in which the design was se-lected limited the cost to \$450,000. Mt. Freedlander says that while he realizes the Council is limited legally to \$450,000 for the building it was not realizes the Council is limited legally to \$450,000 for the building it was not so represented to him by the old Auditorium Board. He says an additional bond issue of \$200,000 was pointed out as a possible asset in the building fund. The bond issue referred to was defeated by the people later, he says. He says he believes the city owes him something for the preparation of the original plans. He says he went to a great deal of expense in making the plans. As to the amount, he says he is willing to negotiate with the city in an effort to arrive at a mutual agreement.

With this question settled he says he is willing to go shead and prepare new plans for a smaller building. The pay he would receive for this work was not discussed at the meeting, but will be taken up at another meeting to be held this afternoon at 2 o'clock in the office of Mayor Albee.

Mr. Freedlander says by changing the general plan of the building from a "circus" or "horse show" affair to a theater effect, a satisfactory and adequate auditorium can be built on the Market block for \$450,000. He says the old plans might just as well be dropped into the wastepaper basket as they would be of no use for the new building. He says the city can put up as building on the Market block with just as good a design and as good a finish for \$450,000 as could have been put into the larger building for the additional amount.

He expressed a willingness to go ahead with now plans. He desires to select a local architect to work with him in developing the plans and supervising the construction.
