It is the intention of the city to experiment in burying garbage, and it is expected that it soon will be started in Marquam Gulch. President Thomas, of the club, suggested to Commissioner Daly that sand and gravel could be pumped up from the Port of Portland dredges, which are at work near the Portland Lumber Company mill, to cover up the garbage, which would be dumped in the gulch at a very small cost. This would cillininate the stench from the garbage and would also make a good fill.


