MAYOR DECLARES MOTORS IN SERV-ICE ARE MONEY-SAVERS. Executive Says That More Cars Could

Be Used to Advantage by Municipality if Procurable.

In answer to purported criticism of the number of automobiles owned by the city and operated by city employes, Mayor Albee and members of the City Commission said yesterday that they do not believe criticism is just, inas-They say there is a need for every automobile in the service at present automobile in the service at present and that more would improve condi-

tions if they could be procured. Of the total of about \$171,000 worth of automobiles and automobile appa-ratus owned by the city, \$111,000 is in

ratus owned by the city, \$111,000 is in the fire department, where auto appa-ratus has been given the place of old horse-drawn apparatus, thus increas-ing the efficiency of the fire depart-ment greatly and cutting down the number of firemen that would be nec-essary if the city still operated its horse-drawn apparatus exclusively. All but a few thousand dollars' worth of the automobile fire apparatus was pur-chased more than a year ago by the




