OREGON GERMAN FIGHT PROHIBITION

State and Nation Movements Denounced at Staatsverband Meeting in Eugene.

IMMIGRATION WORK URGED

Campaign to Get Europeans With Bureau in Portland and Farm Credit System Among Measures Approved by Staatsverband.

ACTION TAKEN BY STAATSVENBUND VON OREGON AT EUGENE

- 1. Resolutions unanimously adopted condemning the state and national prohibition movements as restrictions to personal liberty dangerous to the foundations of government. 2. Resolutions favoring a campaign by the state of Oregon to produce an immigration movement from Europe, with a state bureau in Portland to direct immigrants upon arrival and to protect them from land sharks. 3. Resolutions favoring the introduction of the rural credit system by the establishment of farm credit banks in Oregon. 4. Resolutions favoring the establishment of schools to teach American citizenship to Germans; also schools to teach Germans the English language. 5. Resolutions ordered drawn by executive committee to allow German Women's societies to be taken into the Staatsverband; requesting legislation to give them the same rights as government; asking compulsory arbitration in all industrial disputes.

EUGENE, Or., May 31.—(Special.)—With a cheer that brought every one of the 90 German delegates to the Staatsverband from Oregon to his feet, a resolution was adopted with loud acclamation today condemning state and national prohibition movements as an intolerant, dangerous and un-American doctrine, to be opposed by the Germans of Oregon by every honorable means. The resolution was one of several adopted by the Germans in session here this morning.
