Progressive Chairman Charged With Hostility to Labor.

LETTER SENT TO COLONEL

Amos Pinchot Tells Roosevelt in Confidential Letter Just Made Public That Party Must Rid Itself of Incubus.

NEW YORK, June 10 .- That the Pro gressive party is greatly handicapped by having as the chairman of its execu by having as the chairman of its execu-tive committee George W. Perkins was declared by Amos Pinchot in a con-fidential letter to Colonel Roosevelt in a letter which Pinchot made public today. Pinchot complains that Per-kins' affiliation with the Steel Trust and the Harvester Trust, which "have succeeded most completely in exploit-ing the public and crushing organized labor," is a menace to Progressive suc cess. He sets forth his grounds for objection as follows: First, an element in our party lead-

ership, headed by George W. Perkins, favors the protection of private monopoly in American industry, and since the party's formation has been taking active steps to commit the party to that policy. Second, the chairman of the executive committee (Mr. Perkins) is actively opposed to recognition of labor's right to organize and deal with capital through labor unions, and has equently gone on record to this ef-

Mr. Pinchot says that Mr. Perkins name has been signed to resolutions of the steel corporation declaring against organized labor within its plants and that "Mr. Perkins' views on the most critical issues between capital and organized labor coincide closely with those of John D. Rockefeller, Jr."

In view of all these facts, Mr. Pin-chot says the rank and file of the mafority of the leaders of the party fee that Mr. Perkins' resignation as chairman of the executive committee is necessary. Mr. Pinchot declares he be-lieves even Mr. Perkins will agree with him that the success of the party demands such action immediately

The request was signed by Herman Mann, as secretary, and was trans-mitted to Secretary McAdoo.
