

UMATILLA FARMERS ARE MAKING GOOD

C. D. Mahaffie Inspects Farms in Project, Talks With Men, Makes Report on Visit.

WORK DONE IS DESCRIBED

Alfalfa Is Grown, Fruit Trees Are Set Out, Dairying and Hog Raising Carried On—Settlers Learn Methods of Irrigation.

That farmers are making good on the Umatilla project, whose sandy soil appears to be capable of producing good crops, and that dairying and hog-raising are proving successful, are some of the points made by Charles D. Mahaffie, assistant secretary of the Oregon Conservation Commission, to J. N. Teal, chairman of the commission, yesterday.

Mr. Mahaffie passed two days investigating the project and interviewing its settlers. He walked over and examined in detail 34 different holdings, and talked with the men operating 21 of them. He saw from the road more than half of the project, and talked to 18 other men cultivating land on it whose farms he did not examine.

Mr. Mahaffie explained in his report that he did not make the inspection either as a soil or crop expert, but formed his conclusions from his observation of the results that he saw had been accomplished.

The soil is sandy, mixed with a varying amount of silt, and in some places the bedrock is near the surface. In some places a sort of solidified volcanic ash is encountered, and in other places coarse sand and gravel lie below the surface soil. It is hard of the gravel quality, he says, that causes difficulty in distributing and retaining water.

First Alfalfa of Season Cut. Mr. Mahaffie says in part: "All sorts of crops which ordinarily may be found in temperate climates are being grown successfully on the project. Alfalfa is grown more extensively than any other crop, and the first cutting is being made in most fields at the time of my visit. Practically every farmer on the project raises alfalfa, and the crop this year is excellent. The first cutting will produce from one to two tons per acre.

"Dairying and hog raising are being practiced largely and with success. A great deal of fruit has been put out all over the project, but as yet very little of it is old enough to bear. The trees, however, where they have not been seriously neglected, are in excellent condition, and those old enough to bear are well laden with fruit. Watermelons, corn and rye are raised. The rye is used especially as a "nurse crop," while alfalfa and the like is being started.

Grasshoppers Cause Damage. "Potatoes are in good condition all over the project. A number of the farmers are handling bees extensively and apparently with good results. "I saw some places where the entire surface soil had been scraped away in the process of leveling, leaving the blue sand exposed, and which, being part of an orchard, had been set to trees.

ceed 50 per cent of what has been put into them. "It seems to me that the difficulties of this project are, in the main, due to the fact that the settlers were in general not prepared to handle the land at the time they went onto it. This, both on account of lack of knowledge and on account of lack of financial resources.

LADD AVENUE COST IS SET

Entirely New Pavement at \$31,409 Is Decided Upon. It will cost \$31,409 to pave Ladd avenue through Ladd's Addition from the corner of East Twelfth street to Division and East Twenty-first streets, according to official figures. This includes the circular drive around Central avenue, and the concrete foundation will be five inches thick. The cost will be assessed to the abutting property owners.

Ladd avenue was paved six years and a half ago, and proceedings to repave the street started the opposition on the part of property owners who think they should not be assessed until the expiration of ten years. It was found that the present pavement on Ladd avenue cannot be repaired. A committee from the Ladd's Addition Improvement Association has asked that the letting of the contract be delayed for the present.
