Fair Exchange Asked. "We have ungrudgingly supported the President on all his policies," said one Democratic Senator who now is fearful of the consequences that await him when he returns to his state this Fall, asking re-election, "and it seems only fair that the President in turn should give us as loyal support as we gave him." That is a sentiment that is quite general in the ranks of those ocrats who have surrendered their own convictions on the tariff, and on the canal tolls bill, and it is found among House Democrats as well as among Senators.

Even those who have appealed to the President to come to their aid have little hope that their appeals will be heeded.
