The junior police force, which includes a chief, two captains, four sergeants and "50 regular men," make it their business to look after their wayward companions, and Judge Gatens gives this plan the credit for "cleaning up" petty gambling, cigarette smoking, truancy and other vices among Portland's "newsies."
